



Japan Geography:

6,852 islands Pacific Ocean Sea of Japan East China Sea Mount Fuji Tokyo (9 million people) **World War I: Allies World War II : Axis** Iwo Jima (memorial), Hiroshima, Nagasaki (atomic bombs killed between 105,000-120,000 people & destroyed 70% of buildings. Germany had surrendered in May – yet Japan did not until August) Japanese Traditions & Culture Samurai – special armor, helmet, code of conduct Tea Ceremony – specific, beautiful, precise Gardens & Bonsai – precise, lovely, purposeful Calligraphy – elegant writing Sushi – rice, raw fish, rolled, chop sticks Anime & Manga – big eyes, wild hair, "Disney of Japan" Origami – originated in China Paper Cranes special to Japan. Sumo Wrestling - very large men wrestling - treated like celebrities

Japan Exports: Motor vehicles, Electronic equipment, Machine tools, Steel and nonferrous metals, Ships, Chemicals, Textiles, Processed foods. *The economy of Japan is the third-largest in the world*
