



INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT ROCKY MOUNTAIN BIGHORN SHEEP

The Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep (Ovis Canadensis) is one of 4 native sheep species that inhabit the North American continent and the only one that resides in Colorado.


Bighorn sheep can weigh from 100 to 320 pounds and can reach a standing height of 3 feet.

Their remarkable climbing abilities allow bighorns to scale cliffs or canyon walls to stay out of reach of predators. Their predators include coyotes, wolves, bobcats, and, predominantly in Colorado, mountain lions.

The scientific name Aquilegia comes from Latin, aqua, water, + legere, to collect, referring to the water collected at the base of the spur, or from Latin aquil, eagle, referring to its spurs resembling the talons of an eagle.
