


INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE RED DEER

Red deer are Ireland's largest land mammals. They have a reddish-brown coat, which changes to a brownish-grey in winter. Stags can reach 48 inches at the shoulder, weigh up to 495 lbs and sport large branched antlers.

Male deer are called 'stags' and female deer 'hinds'. Young deer are called 'calves'. Male antlers are U-shaped. During the summer, the deer's coat is a deep chestnut-red color.

The deer have no natural predators since wolves in Ireland have been extinct for 200 years.







A shamrock is a young sprig, used as a symbol of Ireland. Saint Patrick, Ireland's patron saint, is said to have used it as a metaphor for the Christian Holy Trinity.
